

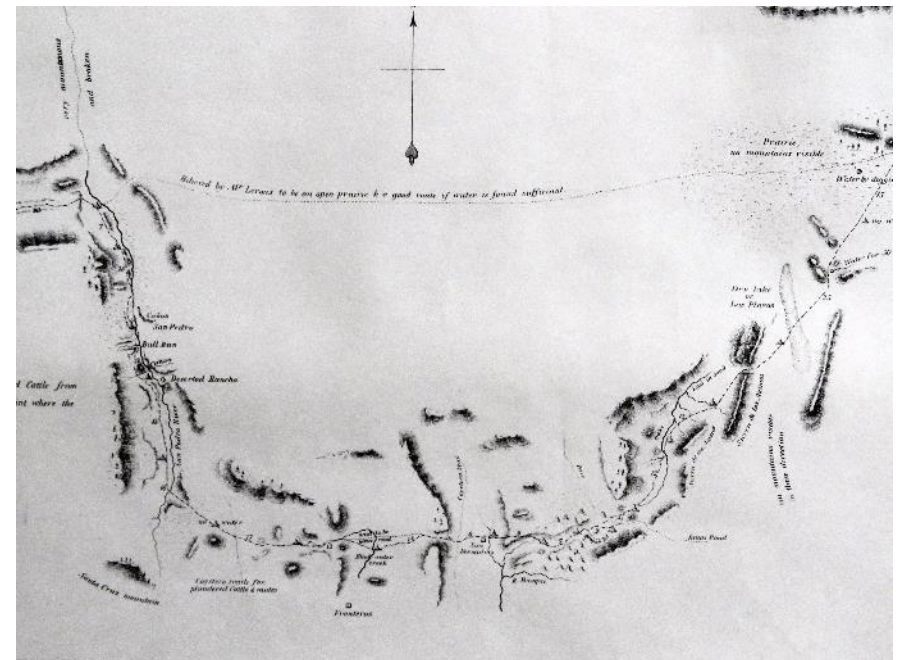

Things to Know

Always bring water and a hat

Bring a cushion or pillow for Schieffelin Hall (pews
have cushions but low wooden backboard may
be uncomfortable)

Daytime temperatures are usually in the 70s but can
drop. Bring a jacket and lap blanket for
Schieffelin Hall and Monument Ranch

Presidio Santa Cruz de Terranate is a mostly level 1.5
mile hike each way (3 miles). Bring good
walking shoes.

If returning from Fairbank to Tombstone rather than
going to Terranate, there’s lots to do and
Debbie will have Schieffelin Hall open

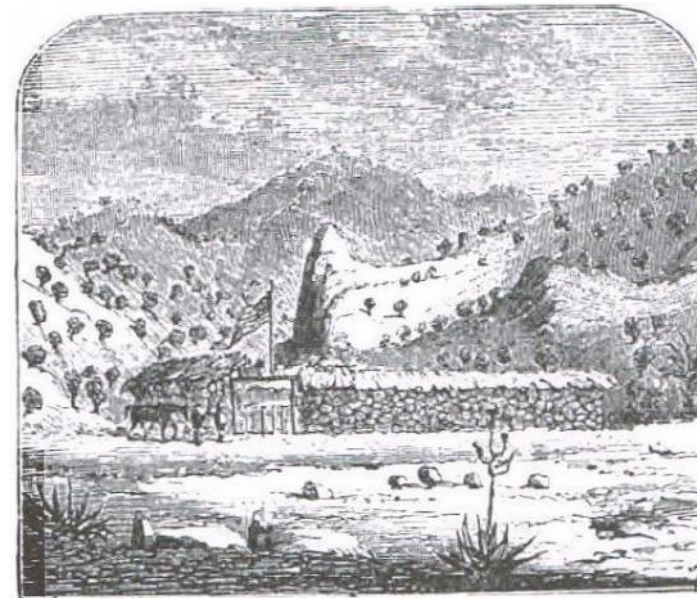

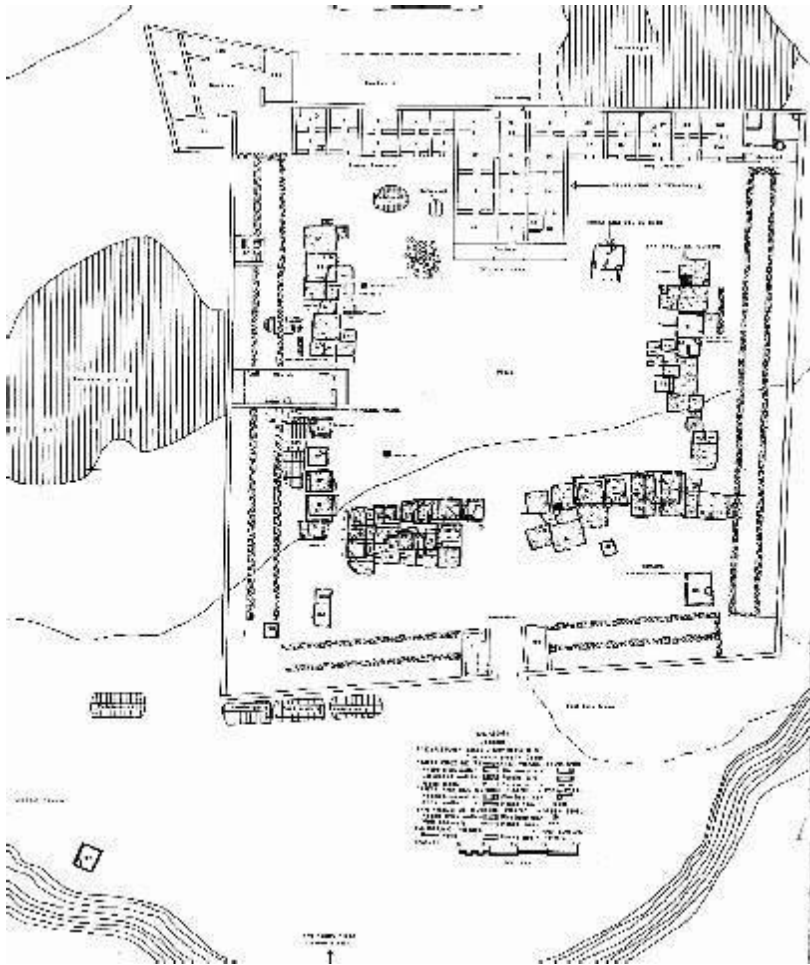
